

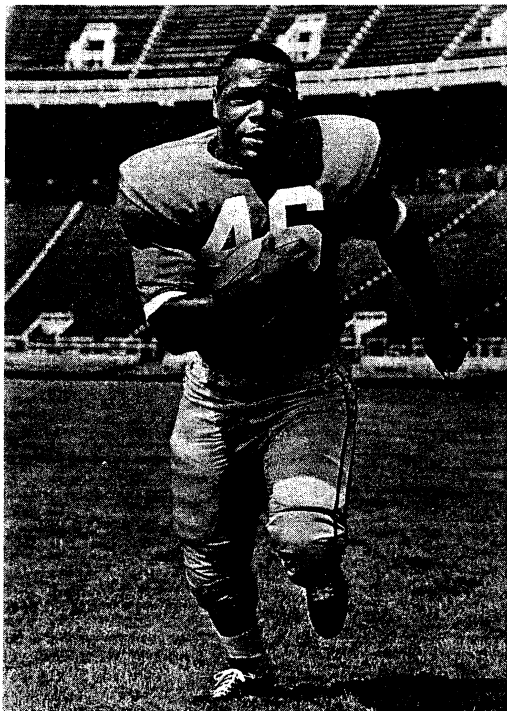

Ohio State Buckeyes  
Crush Illinois, 34-7

CHAMPAIGN, Ill. (AP) — Ohio State's undefeated Buckeyes, sparked by a 100-yard kickoff return by Bill Wentz and excellent quarterbacking of Tom Matte, crushed Illinois 24-7 Saturday in a Big Ten battle of national football powers.

An Illinois homecoming crowd of 71,119 sat quietly through the first half and watched fullback Bob Ferguson pound out a 13-0 Ohio State lead and then gave up all hope when Wentz took the opening kickoff of the second half and went all the way for a touchdown.

It was the third consecutive victory for Ohio State, the nation's fifth-ranked team in the AP weekly poll, while Illinois — rated No. 4 — suffered its first setback of the season.
