Ohio State Football Postgame Notes

- The Buckeyes improve to 33-15 all-time against Michigan State and 16-9 in games played at Ohio Stadium.
- Ohio State is 63-27 all-time in night games and 16-5 in home night games.
- The Buckeyes are 3-0 this season in the Big Ten and 61-5 in conference games since the start of the 2012 season.
- Ohio State is 73-19-5 all-time in Homecoming games.
- The Buckeyes are 27-5 vs. ranked teams since the start of the 2012 season and have won 11 consecutive since a loss to No. 5 Oklahoma in 2017.
- Ohio State has won 12 consecutive games overall dating back to last season, the second-longest active streak among Power Five teams.
- Justin Fields is the only quarterback in the country to have a rushing touchdown and passing touchdown in each of the first six games of the season.
- The Buckeyes scored 20 or more points for the 32nd consecutive game, the second longest streak in the country.

- Ohio State's defense held its sixth straight opponent to 300 yards or less of total offense.
- WR K.J. Hill caught seven passes on Saturday night and moved into No. 2 at Ohio State in career receptions, passing Michael Jenkins (1999-2003) and Cris Carter (1984-86). Hill has 171 career receptions and has caught at least one pass in 40 consecutive games.
- DE Chase Young recorded a sack for the eighth consecutive game.
- Young also moved into No. 8 on the career sacks list for Ohio State. He has 22.5 in his 32-game career.
- RB J.K. Dobbins rushed for 127 yards on Saturday to pass Keith Byars (1982-85) in career rushing to move into No. 8 in school history.
- Ohio State topped 500 yards of total offense for the fifth consecutive game, notching 323 yards on the ground and 206 through the air.
- The defense also produced a takeaway for the fifth-consecutive game to open the season and for the 13th time in the last 15 games dating back to last season.
- Ohio State has outscored its five opponents 200-32 in the first half so far this season after leading 27-10 vs. Michigan State.
