### Gavitt Tipoff Games

The Gavitt Tipoff Games is an annual series between the Big Ten and BIG EAST Conferences and named in honor of Dave Gavitt, founder of the BIG EAST and basketball visionary. The series is in its fifth year and will span eight years with games being played on home sites. The Games will be played in the first full week of the college basketball season. The Buckeyes are 2-0 in the event with wins vs. Providence (72-67) in 2016 and at Creighton (69-60) a year ago.

### Starting Five

- The Buckeyes are 1,150-415 all-time when playing in the state of Ohio (.735) ... against Ohio teams, Ohio State is 236-79 (.749) all-time, regardless of location. The Buckeyes face a pair of intrastate foes this season. Ohio State defeated Cincinnati Nov. 6 at Value City Arena (64-56) and plays Kent State Nov. 25 at St. John Arena (6:30 p.m./BTN). Ohio State is 178-30 vs. Ohio teams in Columbus (.856).
- Three current Buckeyes were named Mr. Basketball in their respective states. Junior Kaleb Wesson was named Ohio Mr. Basketball as a senior at Westerville South High School ... freshman D.J. Carton was named Mr. Basketball in Iowa in 2019 as a senior at Bettendorf High School and freshman E.J. Liddell was named Illinois Mr. Basketball in both 2018 and 2019 after leading Belleville High

### Buckeyes Among Leaders in Home Wins

Ohio State is No. 2 nationally for the most home wins with a 164-30 (.845) record since the 2009-10 season. Maryland is the next-best Big Ten team at No. 14 with 151 wins. Going back to the 2008-09 season to the present, the Buckeyes own the third-most home victories with 179 wins over 212 games (179-33). The Buckeyes also have played the eighth-most ranked teams in the country since 2005. Ohio State has played 144 (59 wins) opponents ranked among the *Associated Press* Top 25 during that span.

School to back-to-back state titles.

- Andre and Kaleb Wesson are one of 16 sets of brothers playing in NCAA Division I this season and one of three sets in the Big Ten. Iowa (McCaffery) and Maryland (Mitchell) also have siblings on the roster.
- Ohio State has 58 players all-time with 1,000 or more career points, the ninth most nationally and the most of any Big Ten school (research credit: Duke). Kaleb Wesson is the next Buckeye on schedule to reach the milestone with 827 career points over his career.
- There were a couple support staff changes during the offseason for the Buckeyes with the departure of Scoonie Penn, director of player development, and Jeff Deits, men's basketball athletic trainer. Both Penn and Deits left for the National Basketball Association's Memphis Grizzlies. Penn accepted an assistant coach position and Deits will be the head athletic trainer. Terence Dials will be the director of professional development in place of Penn. The athletic trainer position with the Buckeyes is in the process of being filled.

### Noting the UMass Lowell Game

- Five players scored in double digits for the Buckeyes: Alonzo Gaffney (10), Kyle Young (10), Luther Muhammad (11), D.J. Carton (13) and Kaleb Wesson (13).
- The last time Ohio State placed five in double figures was vs. Iowa (2/26/19); Andre Wesson (11), Kaleb Wesson (18), Justin Ahrens (29), Keyshawn Woods (13) and Duane Washington, Jr. (10)
- Ohio State has allowed 20 or fewer field goals

in each of the first two games. Cincinnati made 19 buckets, UMass Lowell 20.

- The last time the Buckeyes allowed 20 or fewer field goals in back to back games was in 2018: 20(51), vs. Minnesota (12/2/18) and 19(58) vs. Illinois (12/5/18).
- Freshman Alonzo Gaffney made his first appearance as a Buckeye vs. the River Hawks. He sank his first career field goal attempt, a 3-pointer from the left corner. Duane Washington Jr. was the last to knock down his first shot from 3-point range, last year in the opener at Cincinnati.
- All available players saw game time.
- With Kaleb Wesson's double-double (13 pts./13 rebs.), Ohio State has 916 D-Ds all-time and own a record of 642-274 in those games.
- Wesson's D-D was his seventh of his career and first this season. Ohio State is 7-0 when he records a D-D.
- This was the first time Chris Holtmann has played UMass Lowell as a head coach. His record against them is now 1-0.
- Kaleb Wesson had a double-double in the first half with 11 points and 11 rebounds. Jae'Sean Tate was the last Buckeye with a first half double-double vs. Wisconsin (2/23/17) with 13 points and 10 rebounds.
- Wesson surpassed 400 career rebounds with his 13 total rebounds and now has 408 in his career.
- Wesson also surpassed 100 career assists with five assists bringing him to a total of 102. He tied his career high in helpers vs. the River Hawks.
- Kyle Young scored 11 points making it his second consecutive game in double digits. He had 14 points in the opener vs. Cincinnati.
- D.J. Carton scored 13 points against UMass Lowell making it the first game where he has scored in double digits.
- Alonzo Gaffney scored 10 points and had eight rebounds in his first career game for the Buckeyes.
- Ibrahima Diallo played in his first career game for Ohio State.

### The Villanova Series

Ohio State has won two of three previous meetings against Villanova. The two schools last played in the 2003-04 season when the Buckeyes knocked off Villanova in the Maui Invitational in

Lahaina, Maui, Hawaii. Tony Stockman led Ohio State with 23 points in leading the Buckeyes to a 67-66 win. Terence Dials, now the director of professional development with Ohio State men's basketball, scored 12 points and grabbed a game-high nine rebounds in the win. Ohio State led by 15 at the end of 20 minutes and survived a late rally by the Wildcats to escape with the win. This season the Wildcats are 1-0 after the season opener vs. Army Nov. 5. Villanova won that one 97-54.

This is the 108th season of Big Ten membership in men's basketball for the Buckeyes and the 121st overall for the sport at Ohio State. The Buckeyes are 99-21 in season openers and 102-17 in the first home game of the season. Ohio State is 55-63 in the first true road game of the year. In Big Ten Conference play, the Buckeyes are 58-46 in league openers, 72-33 in the first conference home game of the season and 39-66 in league road openers. Ohio State is 40-20 when the first conference game of the year is at home and 19-26 when opening conference play on the road.

most selections on the squad of 10 league players. Wesson also was listed as one of 20 preseason candidates for the Karl Malone Award, given annually by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame to the best power forward in the country. Wesson, listed as a center with the Buckeyes, could play his way on to the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award list for the country's best center when the award lists are reduced to 10 in mid-February and to five in March. He was named to the preseason Top 50 watch list for the Wooden Award Nov. 6.

## Buckeyes Face Daunting Schedule

The No. 16 Buckeyes face several *Associated Press* Top 10 teams during the 2019-20 season. Preseason No. 1 Michigan State takes on Ohio State in the final regular-season game of the year for both teams in East Lansing March 8 (4:30 p.m./CBS). No. 2 Kentucky and the Buckeyes travel to Las Vegas Dec. 21 for a 5:15 p.m. game in the CBSSports Classic. No. 7 Maryland and the Buckeyes play both in Columbus Feb. 23 and in College Park Jan. 7. Ohio State travels to No. 9 North Carolina Dec. 4 in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge after No. 10 Villanova visits Columbus Nov. 13 for a Gavitt Games contest. No. 23 Purdue rounds out the Top 25 competition for the Buckeyes when the Boilermakers make a Jan. 15 appearance at Value City Arena. Illinois, Cincinnati (W, 64-56) and Michigan also received preseason votes for Top 25 consideration.

## Dials Returns to Ohio State Sidelines

Terence Dials, the 2006 Big Ten Player of the Year and 2015 inductee into the Ohio State Athletics Hall of Fame, was named the director of professional development with the men's basketball program, Chris Holtmann, head coach of the Buckeyes, announced Sept. 4. His duties will primarily include providing and arranging professional development and community service opportunities for the Buckeyes. Dials will work with the Eugene D. Smith Leadership Institute to arrange internships, mentors, job fairs and other personal and career growth initiatives for student-athletes. He also will provide academic support, oversight and mentoring.

## Buckeyes Earn NABC Academic Honor, Lane Named B1G Distinguished Scholar

The National Association of Basketball Coaches named the 2018-19 Buckeyes a winner of the NABC Team Academic Excellence Award after the squad posted a team GPA of 3.03 last year. It marks the second-consecutive year Chris Holtmann's team has earned the honor.

## Cincinnati Game Second Earliest Opener in Ohio State History

When Ohio State tipped vs. Cincinnati in the 2019-20 opener, the game was the second earliest opening date in Ohio State history. The Nov. 6 date with the Bearcats in Columbus was second only to the Nov. 5, 2004 opener, the first game of the Thad Matta era, vs. Towson State in the Guardian's Classic at Value City Arena. Ohio State won that game 74-53.

### Noting the 2019-20 Ohio State Schedule

- Ohio State will play its first seven games of the season, plus an exhibition, at home with six at Value City Arena and one at St. John Arena. Three of the four non-Big Ten games in December will be played outside Columbus (vs. North Carolina in Big Ten/ACC Challenge, vs. Kentucky in CBSSports Classic (Las Vegas) and vs. West Virginia in Cleveland Classic).
- The Buckeyes again will take part in the annual Big Ten/ACC Challenge. Ohio State travels to North Carolina this year Dec. 4.
- Now in its sixth year, Ohio State will again play in the CBSSports Classic. The event will take place in Las Vegas this season Dec. 21. The Buckeyes take on Kentucky while North Carolina and UCLA play in the second game.
- Villanova will travel to Ohio State Nov. 13. The game is part of The Gavitt Games, which pits members of the Big Ten vs. Big East opponents.
- Two Big Ten Conference games will be played in early December after the league expanding to a 20-game, regular-season slate in 2018-19. Ohio State will play Penn State in Columbus Dec. 7 and travel to Minnesota Dec. 15.
- The annual Big Ten Tournament will be contested in Indianapolis in 2020, Chicago in 2021 and then back to Indianapolis in 2022.
- The Buckeyes will have 18 home games in 2018-19 plus an exhibition contest vs. Cedarville Oct. 30.
- Seven Big Ten teams (Minnesota, Indiana, Michigan, Penn State, Maryland, Wisconsin and Nebraska) battle the Buckeyes twice during the regular season with three (Illinois, Purdue, Rutgers) traveling only to Columbus. Ohio State hits the road to face Iowa, Michigan State and Northwestern this year.
- Two Big Ten Conference games will be played in December. Ohio State faces Penn State at home Dec. 7 and then travels to Minnesota Dec. 15. The Buckeyes are 4-0 in December conference games the last two years with wins at Wisconsin and vs. Michigan in 2017 and victories over Minnesota in Columbus and Illinois in Chicago in 2018.
- Ohio State will play 19 regular-season games against 13 teams that advanced to postseason play in 2019. ### 108 Years in Big Ten

Ohio State celebrated 108 years as a member of the Big Ten Conference in men's basketball in 2020. The Buckeyes finished in the No. 6 spot in the 1913 conference standings, the first season of league play. Over 108 seasons, Ohio State has earned 20 Big Ten regular-season titles with 29 NCAA Tournament appearances, one national championship (1960) and 10 trips to the Final Four. Ten former coaches and players are members of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame while 55 student-athletes have been drafted by National Basketball Association teams, including 24 in the first round.

### CBS Sports Classic-Year 6

CBS Sports has brought together four of the nation's most prestigious college basketball teams the last four years and will do so again this year in 2019-20. Kentucky, North Carolina, Ohio State and UCLA, meet for a college basketball showcase, the CBSSPORTS CLASSIC again this season. CBS Sports televises the doubleheader and has done so since the first year of the event in Chicago (2014). These four schools have combined to win 26 national championships and are among the winningest college basketball programs of all-time. The event debuted at the United Center in Chicago Dec. 20, 2014. North Carolina faced Ohio State and UCLA took on Kentucky. The CBSSPORTS CLASSIC moved to Barclays Cen-

The Buckeyes meet Kentucky this year in Las Vegas (Dec. 21/5:15 p.m./CBS).

**Wesson Brothers = Difference Makers**

Senior Andre Wesson along with junior sibling Kaleb Wesson were significant weapons for Chris Holtmann's second edition of Ohio State basketball in 2018-19. The brothers helped the Buckeyes to a 25-9 record in 2017-18 with Kaleb earning Big Ten All-Freshman Team honors after averaging 10.2 points and 4.9 rebounds. Andre started five games and appeared in 34 as a sophomore. Kaleb led the Buckeyes in scoring as a sophomore with 14.6 points and 6.9 rebounds while Andre averaged 8.6 points and 4.1 boards over his junior season.

**Holtmann Era in Columbus**

June 9, 2017 marked the first day of the Chris Holtmann era at Ohio State. After six seasons as a head coach, including three at Butler, Holtmann became the 14th head coach in Ohio State men's basketball history. In his young career to date, Holtmann already has earned coach-of-the-year honors in the Big South Conference (2013), where he spent three seasons coaching Gardner-Webb (2001-13), and in the Big East (2017) in the final of three seasons with the Bulldogs. His first game in Columbus, a win over Robert Morris, was the 200th of his head coaching career. Holtmann was named the 2018 Big Ten Coach of the Year, has won at least 20 games in each of his two seasons in Columbus, has taken the Buckeyes to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances and has won an NCAA game each season.

**Holtmann vs. the Ranked**

In nine seasons as a head coach, three at Gardner Webb (2011-13), three at Butler (2015-17) and

now in year three at Ohio State, Chris Holtmann is 17-28 overall against opponents ranked among the *Associated Press* Top 25. He was 0-2 at GW and 13-13 at Butler. His teams were 6-9 vs. Top 10 foes at Butler and 3-4 vs. Top 5 opponents. He is 4-13 at Ohio State.

• The Buckeyes are 39-70 vs. Top 5 opponents all-time. The Buckeyes knocked off No. 1 Michigan State 80-64 in Columbus and No. 3 Purdue 64-63 in West Lafayette in 2018. Ohio State's last non-conference game vs. a Top 5 opponent was in New Orleans vs. No. 5 North Carolina in the CBSSports Classic (L, 86-72, 12/23/17). Ohio State's last win vs. a non-conference Top 5 opponent was 74-67 in the CBS event over No. 4 Kentucky in Brooklyn, New York, Dec. 19, 2015. Ohio State was unranked vs. Michigan State, the Tar Heels and Wildcats. Against the nation's No. 1 team, Ohio State is 9-11 all-time, including a 6-5 record in Columbus. Junior Kaleb Wesson, a 6-9 center from nearby Westerville, Ohio, was named Mr. Basketball in the state of Ohio following his senior year at Westerville South High School in 2017. Wesson earned the 12th Ohio Mr. Basketball award among nine players to sign with the Buckeyes out of high school and the 13th among those to ultimately play for Ohio State. Tony Stockman earned the honor in 2000 but elected to start his career at Clemson. He later transferred to Ohio State and played in Columbus in 2004 and 2005.

**Throwback Game at St. John Arena**

Ohio State plays Kent State as part of the 2019 Ohio State Classic at historic St. John Arena Nov. 25.



### A few notes on the venue:

- Ohio State first played at St. John Arena during the 1956-57 season. The last season the Buckeyes called SJA their home was 1997-98. Ohio State began playing at its current home, Value City Arena, in 1998-99.
- Ohio State has an overall record of 432-151 (.741) at SJA, which includes a 6-0 record in games played at SJA since the end of the 1998 season.
- The Buckeyes had last played at SJA in 2010, an 85-60 win over Western Carolina (12/12/2010).
- The facility is named after former Ohio State director of athletics and men's basketball coach L.W. St. John.
- The first game played at SJA was against Butler (12/1/1956), a 98-82 win for the Buckeyes.
- Capacity is 13,276. The CSU game was a sellout.
- Since the Ohio State men's and women's basketball teams moved to Value City Arena, St. John has been the competition home for the men's and women's volleyball, wrestling, fencing and men's and women's gymnastics teams. Those team moved out of SJA and into the Covelli Center on Ohio State's campus following the 2018-19 season.
- SJA also is filled to capacity prior to each home football game during "Skull Session" where the Ohio State Marching Band practices and briefly welcomes the football Buckeyes on their way to Ohio Stadium.
- Between 1960 and 1964, the Buckeyes won 50-consecutive games on their home floor.

### Six Seasons with 20 Wins for Holtmann

Holtmann teams have won 20 or more games in each of his last six full years as a head coach. Ohio State finished 20-15 overall after the win vs. Iowa State and the loss to Houston in the 2019 NCAA Tournament. Gardner-Webb won 21 games in 2013 with Holtmann at the helm. Butler reached 23, 22 and 25 wins over the three seasons before Holtmann took over at Ohio State in 2017-18. Of Ohio State's 14 head coaches in the history of men's basketball, only Gary Williams and Thad Matta won 20 games in their first season in Columbus. The Buckeyes were 25-9 in 2017-18. Williams was 20-13 in 1987 and took the Buckeyes to the NCAA Tournament, where the team defeated Kentucky for its 20th win of the season before losing to Georgetown. Matta was 20-12 in 2005 but the Buckeyes were ineligible for postseason competition that year. The Buckeyes won their 20th game in the Big Ten Tournament over Penn State before ending the season with a loss to Wisconsin. Holtmann is the first Ohio State coach in history to win 20 regular-season games in his first year in Columbus. The 25 wins in 2017-18 is an Ohio State record for most wins by a first-year coach.

### Ohio State's 29 20-Win Seasons

The win over Iowa State in the opening round of the 2019 NCAA Tournament gave the Buckeyes win No. 20 for the 2018-19 season. The feat marked the 29th time in Ohio State men's basketball history the Buckeyes reached 20 victories in a season. The first was in 1950 when William H.H. Dye led the Buckeyes to a 22-4 record in his final of four

seasons on the Ohio State sidelines. Fred Taylor was the next coach in Columbus to guide Ohio State to the 20-win plateau with a 25-3 season in 1960, the year the Buckeyes reached and won the NCAA title game. Taylor led Ohio State to six 20-win seasons in his career, including a streak of four-consecutive from 1960-1963. Taylor's last 20-win campaign was in 1971. Eldon Miller led Ohio State to four 20-win campaigns from 1980-85 before Gary Williams coached two seasons with 20-13 records in 1987 and 1988. Randy Ayers's 1991 and 1992 seasons both ended with 20 or more wins with 27 and 26 respectively. The Thad Matta era (2005-2017) included 12-consecutive 20-win seasons from 2005-2016. Chris Holtmann has reached 20-plus wins in each of his seasons in Columbus to give the Buckeyes a total of 29 in Ohio State history.

### The Cincinnati Opener

Ohio State opened the 2018-19 season officially Nov. 7, 2018 at Cincinnati, the first meeting against the Bearcats on either team's campus since 1921 (Columbus/L, 33-17/Dec. 10, 1921) and the first time at Cincinnati since the 1920 season (Cincinnati/W, 35-13/Jan. 3, 1920). Ohio State earned a 64-56 win in the first game at renovated Fifth-Third Arena last year and is 8-4 all-time vs. the Bearcats after winning by the identical score, 64-56, Nov. 6 in Columbus. Three of the last six-meetings have come in the NCAA Tournament. Cincinnati defeated the Buckeyes for the national championship in both 1961 and 1962. Ohio State defeated UC in the 2006 Wooden Tradition in Indianapolis (72-50) and then most recently in the 2012 NCAA East Regional Semifinals in Boston (81-66).

### Noting Ohio State vs. Ohio teams

- Ohio State improved its record to 236-79 versus teams from Ohio with the 64-56 win over Cincinnati Nov. 6 in Columbus.
- Chris Holtmann has a 10-5 career record versus teams from Ohio.
- Ohio State is 28-1 vs. Ohio teams since the 1995-96 season. The loss was to Dayton in the 2014 NCAA Tournament. The Buckeyes fell 60-59 (3/20/2014) to the No. 22 Flyers.
- Ohio State is 178-30 in Columbus vs. Ohio teams, 50-41 in road games and 8-8 at neutral sites all-time.
- The Buckeyes played three teams from the state of Ohio last year. In addition to the road game at Cincinnati, Ohio State hosted Cleveland State Nov. 23 and Youngstown State Dec. 18 in Columbus.

# HEAD COACH CHRIS HOLTSMANN

Chris Holtmann took over the Ohio State men's basketball head coaching position June 12, 2017 after a successful three-year stint as head coach at Butler (2015-2017). He was an assistant at Butler during the 2013-14 season after a three-year run as head coach at Gardner-Webb (2011-13).



Holtmann was named conference coach of the year at both his previous stops earning the honor in 2013 in the Big South and then in 2017 in the Big East following a 25-9 campaign with the Bulldogs. He earned the 2018 Big Ten Coach of the Year Award as well after a 25-9 overall record and a 15-3 campaign and second-place finish in the Big Ten regular season.

The 14th head coach in Ohio State history, Holtmann is a 1994 graduate of Taylor University, where he majored in Psychology. He also has a master's degree in Athletics Administration from Ball State (2000). He was elected to the Taylor University Athletics Hall of Fame in October of 2018.

As a player at Taylor, he earned NAIA All-American status in 1994 under the direction of Paul Patterson.

Prior to becoming a head coach, Holtmann was an assistant for John Groce (Ohio U.) and Brandon Miller (Butler). Both Groce and Miller were former Ohio State assistant coaches.
