- Kaleb Wesson led the Buckeyes in scoring for the second-consecutive season with 468 points (14.6 ppg.) in 2018-19 and 434 (14.0 ppg.) in 2019-20. The last Buckeye to lead the team in scoring in back-to-back seasons was Jared Sullinger in 2011 (635/17.2 ppg.) and 2012 (647/17.5 ppg.).
- Kaleb Wesson led the Buckeyes in field goal percentage (min. 100 made FGs) for the third-consecutive season in 2018-19, making 136-305 shots (.446). He made 118-201 (.562) as a freshman in 2017-18 and 156-312 (.500) as a sophomore in 2018-19. The last Buckeye to lead the team in field goal percentage for three-consecutive years was Lawrence Funderburke from 1992-1994 (1992, 115-210/.548; 1993, 186-349/.533; 1994, 188-345/.545).
- Kaleb Wesson led the Buckeyes in 3-point shooting percentage (.425/45-107) among players with 50 or more attempts. He is the first Ohio State center to lead the Buckeyes from distance.
- Luther Muhammad led the Buckeyes at the foul line (min. 50 made) in 2019-20 making 51-60 at the stripe for a free throw percentage of 85 percent. Classmate Duane Washington Jr. was a close second with 50 makes in 60 attempts (.833). CJ Walker (56-69/.812) and Andre Wesson (44-55/.800) also connected on 80 percent or better from the line.
- The last Buckeye to lead the team at the foul

Buckeyes Among Leaders in Home Wins

Ohio State is No. 2 nationally for the most home wins with a 178-32 (.848) record since the 2009-10 season. Maryland is the next-best Big Ten team at No. 11 with 165 wins. Going back to the 2008-09 season to the present, the Buckeyes also own the third-most home victories with 193 wins over 228 games (193-35). The Buckeyes also have played the sixth-most ranked teams in the country since 2005. Ohio State has played 154 (65 wins/10th) opponents ranked among the *Associated Press* Top 25 during that span.

line at an 85 percent or better shooting percentage was Jon Diebler in 2010. He made 69-79/.873). Deshaun Thomas was the last Buckeye to lead the team at over 80 percent accuracy in 2013 (141-169/.834).

- Ohio State made 261 of 700 3-point attempts in 2019-20, the sixth most 3s made in a season in OSU history. The Buckeyes made 264 a season ago, fourth most all-time. The 261 made this year were in just 31 games, the fewest number of games played among the Top 10 all-time single-season team 3-point shooting totals in Ohio State history. The 700 attempts this season rank No. 7 for most in a season in Ohio State history.
- The Buckeyes made 14 of 26 3-point attempts in the home win over Penn State Dec. 7, 2019. The 14 makes tied for the ninth most in a single game in Ohio State history and the most since the Buckeyes made 15 against Purdue Fort Wayne Nov. 11, 2018 in a 107-61 win at Value City Arena.
- Kaleb Wesson was one of just three players nationally in 2019-20 to score more than 430 points (434) while also recording at least 288 rebounds and making 45 3-pointers. He is the only player among the power five conferences to do so. Ty Flowers of LIU (471/318/61) and Ethan Stair of Mercer (467/296/60) were the others.
- Kaleb Wesson led the Buckeyes with 9.3 rebounds per game and a total of 288 in 2019-20. He has led Ohio State in rebounding in each of the last two years after grabbing 221 (6.9 rpg.) in 2018-19. He is the first Buckeye since Jared Sullinger (2011, 2012) to lead the Buckeyes on the boards in back-to-back campaigns. Wesson's 9.3 rebounds a

game this year are the most per game since Sullinger grabbed 9.7 a contest in 2011-12.

- The Buckeyes defeated Penn State 106-74 in the Big Ten Conference opener Dec. 7, 2019 in Columbus. Ohio State is 77-1 when scoring 100+ all-time, including a 57-0 home record. Ohio State last scored 100 in a league game vs. Penn State Jan. 5, 2006, 104-69, in Columbus.

- There have been 42 seasons in which an Ohio State player has recorded 10 or more double-doubles during the schedule. Kaleb Wesson had 11 in 2019-20 to finish his career with 17. That total rates tied for 21st most all-time in an Ohio State career. After junior Kyle Young and freshman E.J. Liddell recorded their first career double-doubles this season, there have been 120 players all-time to reach a combination of 10 or more points-rebounds-assists-steals or blocks in a season. There were 15 games in which a Buckeye recorded a double-double in 2019-20, Ohio State was 13-2 in those games.

- Value City Arena at the Jerome Schottenstein Center has been the home of the Buckeyes for the last 22 years (1998-99 to 2019-20). The Buckeyes have played 387 games at the facility and have averaged 15,512 fans a game for a total of 6,003,184 fans. Ohio State reached 6,000,000 in attendance all-time March 5, 2020 when the 13,198th fan entered the facility to witness the Buckeyes' 71-63 win over Illinois.

- The Buckeyes were 4-1 in five sold out games at Value City Arena in 2019-20, including the last two over ranked Big Ten Conference opponents. Ohio State is 57-16 all-time in sold out games at Value City Arena, including a 22-11 record vs. ranked conference opponents.

Starting Five

- Kaleb Wesson, a junior center, was named 2020 Second Team All-Big Ten by the league coaches and media. Wesson led the Buckeyes in both scoring (14.0 ppg.) and rebounding (9.3 rpg.) during his junior season. Danny Hummer, who is currently working on a graduate degree at Ohio State and was a senior on the 2019-20 roster, was named by the Big Ten Ohio State's Sportsmanship Award honoree.

- Ohio State defeated four 2019-20 conference champions during non-conference play and another in league play this season. The Buckeyes opened the season downing Cincinnati, the American Athletic

Conference co-champion (13-5), then knocked off Big East co-champion Villanova (13-5) followed by SEC outright winner Kentucky (15-3). Ohio State also split with Big Ten co-champion Maryland (14-6).

- The Buckeyes are 1,164-418 all-time when playing in the state of Ohio (.736) ... against Ohio teams, Ohio State is 237-79 (.749) all-time, regardless of location. The Buckeyes faced a pair of intrastate foes this season. Ohio State defeated Cincinnati Nov. 6 at Value City Arena (64-56) and then Kent State Nov. 25 at St. John Arena (W, 72-51). Ohio State is 179-30 vs. Ohio teams in Columbus (.856).

- Andre and Kaleb Wesson were one of 16 sets of brothers playing on the same team in NCAA Division I this season and one of two sets in the Big Ten. Iowa (McCaffery) also had siblings on the roster.

- Ohio State has 58 players all-time with 1,000 or more career points, the ninth-most nationally and the most of any Big Ten school (research credit: Duke). Kaleb Wesson is the most recent Buckeye to reach the milestone with 1,240 career points over his career. He became the 37th Ohio State player all-time to reach 500 rebounds with nine vs. West Virginia Dec. 29. His 14 points vs. Michigan March 1 moved him over the 1,200-point mark.

Off the Bench

- The Ohio State Department of Athletics and the men's basketball program recognized the 1960 National Championship Team at halftime of the game vs. Illinois March 5. That team finished the 1960 campaign with a 25-3 record and a 13-1 record in the Big Ten. The Buckeyes defeated California in the national championship game 75-55 at the Final Four in San Francisco March 19, 1960.

- In the first NCAA NET rankings of the year, released Dec. 16, 2019, Ohio State was rated the No. 1 team nationally after its 9-1 start. The Buckeyes were ranked No. 1 in the first NET rankings a year ago as well. This year Ohio State played 14 Quad 1 games (5-9) and eight Quad 2 games (7-1).

- When the then-No. 5 Buckeyes tipped vs. the No. 6 Kentucky Wildcats Dec. 21 in Las Vegas, the Wesson family reached 300 games played as Buckeyes. Keith Wesson, who lettered for Ohio State from 1983-87, played in 115 games. Senior Andre Wesson appeared in 127 games while junior Kaleb Wesson took the court as a Buckeye 96

times. In 338 games played, the Wessons scored 2,324 points for an average of 6.9 a game. Andre passed Keith in total games played at Northwestern Jan. 28.

- In three seasons as Ohio State head coach, Chris Holtmann teams have made 10 or more 3s 26 times (20-6 rcd.). Ohio State made 10+ from distance five times in 2017-18 and posted a 4-1 record in those games. The Buckeyes were 5-5 in 2018-19 and are 11-0 this year when making 10+ 3-pointers.

- The Buckeyes ended with a 9-3 record over the final 12 games of the Big Ten regular season, tied for the best finish in the league with Wisconsin and Maryland.

Ohio State Big Ten Tournament History

The No. 7 seed in the canceled 2020 Big Ten Tournament, the Buckeyes are 27-15 all-time in BTT play since the event began in 1998. Ohio State has won 24 of its last 35 league tournament games, including 16 of the last 23. By seed, Ohio State is 11-2 as No. 1, 3-1 as No. 2, 2-1 as No. 3, 4-3 as No. 5, 2-2 as No. 6, 1-1 as No. 7, 4-2

as No. 8, 0-1 as No. 9 and 0-2 as No. 11. Ohio State has entered the tournament as the No. 1 seed five times (2000, 2006, 2007, 2010, 2011). The Buckeyes have four titles (2007, 2010, 2011, 2013) and eight title game appearances (2003, 2006, 2009, 2012). Ohio State, 13-6 in BTT openers, has been seeded higher in 25 BTT games all-time and are 21-4 in those games. As the lower seed, the Buckeyes are 6-11 all-time. Nine of the Buckeyes' opening games in the last 15 years have been decided by six or fewer points. Ohio State is 8-1 in those games.

Ohio State and the Buckeyes have won 20 or more games in 15 of the last 16 seasons.

Seven Seasons with 20 Wins for Holtmann

Holtmann teams have won 20 or more games in each of his last seven full years as a head coach. The Buckeyes finished 21-10 in 2019-20. Ohio State finished 20-15 overall after the win vs. Iowa State and the loss to Houston in the 2019 NCAA Tournament. Gardner-Webb won 21 games in 2013 with Holtmann at the helm. Butler reached 23, 22 and 25 wins over the three seasons before Holtmann took over at Ohio State in 2017-18. Of Ohio State's 14 head coaches in the history of men's basketball, only Gary Williams and Thad Matta won 20 games in their first season in Columbus. The Buckeyes were 25-9 in 2017-18. Williams was 20-13 in 1987 and took the Buckeyes to the NCAA Tournament, where the team defeated Kentucky for its 20th win of the season before losing to Georgetown. Matta was 20-12 in 2005 but the Buckeyes were ineligible for postseason competition that year. Ohio State won its 20th game in the 2005 Big Ten Tournament over Penn State before ending the season with a loss to Wisconsin. Holtmann is the first Ohio State coach in history to win 20 regular-season games in his first year in Columbus. The 25 wins in 2017-18 is an Ohio State record for most wins by a first-year coach. He also joins Matta as the only Ohio State head coaches to win 20 or more games in each of their first three seasons in Columbus.

Ohio State's 30 20-Win Seasons

The win over No. 19 Michigan March 1 gave the Buckeyes win No. 20 for the 2019-20 season. The feat marked the 30th time in Ohio State men's basketball history the Buckeyes reached 20 victories in a season. The first was in 1950 when William H.H. Dye led the Buckeyes to a 22-4 record in his final of four

seasons on the Ohio State sidelines. Fred Taylor was the next coach in Columbus to guide Ohio State to the 20-win plateau with a 25-3 season in 1960, the year the Buckeyes reached and won the NCAA title game. Taylor led Ohio State to six 20-win seasons in his career, including a streak of four-consecutive from 1960-1963. Taylor's last 20-win campaign was in 1971. Eldon Miller led Ohio State to four 20-win campaigns from 1980-85 before Gary Williams coached two seasons with 20-13 records in 1987 and 1988. Randy Ayers's 1991 and 1992 seasons both ended with 20 or more wins with 27 and 26 respectively. The Thad Matta era (2005-2017) included 12-consecutive 20-win seasons from 2005-2016. Chris Holtmann has reached 20-plus wins in each of his three seasons in Columbus to give the Buckeyes a total of 30 in Ohio State history.

Balanced vs. the Ranked

In the last five games vs. Top 25 foes, all in Big Ten Conference play (at No. 20 Iowa, No. 7 Maryland, No. 19 Michigan, No. 23 Illinois, at No. 16 Michigan State), Ohio State had five players average 10 or more points. Kaleb Wesson (13.2), Duane Washington Jr. (14.6 ppg.), CJ Walker (13.4), Andre Wesson (10.4 ppg.) and E.J. Liddell (10.4 ppg.) all have been consistent recently vs. the ranked. The Buckeyes were 4-0 vs. Top 10 teams and, again, five Buckeyes average 10 or more points in those games.

108 Years in Big Ten

Ohio State celebrated 108 years as a member of the Big Ten Conference in men's basketball in 2020. The Buckeyes finished in the No. 6 spot in the 1913 conference standings, the first season of league play. Over 108 seasons, Ohio State has earned 20 Big Ten regular-season titles with 29 NCAA Tournament appearances, one national championship (1960) and 10 trips to the Final Four. Ten former coaches and players are members of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame while 55 student-athletes have been drafted by National Basketball Association teams, including 24 in the first round.

Kaleb Wesson on Honors Lists

Junior Kaleb Wesson was tabbed a member of the **2019-20 Preseason All-Big Ten** squad by conference media Oct. 2, 2019. He was one of three unanimous selections on the squad of 10 league players. The league coaches and media selected him **2020 Second Team All-Big Ten** March 9. Wesson was named by the Atlanta Tipoff Club a Top 30 finalist for the **2020 Citizen Naismith Trophy for Men's Player of the Year** (Feb. 13). Wesson also was listed as one of 20 preseason candidates for the **Karl Malone Award**, given annually by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame to the best power forward in the country. Wesson, listed as a center with the Buckeyes, played his way on to the **Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award** list for the country's best center. It was announced Feb. 7 that he was a Top 10 candidate for that honor. He was named to the preseason Top 50 watch list for the **Wooden Award** Nov. 6, 2019 and was selected to the Midseason Top 25 Jan. 8. He also was named by the U.S. Basketball Writers as one of 46 players being considered for the **Oscar Robertson Trophy** Dec. 5, 2019. The award is given to the organization's national player of the year selection.

Carton Wins First BIG FOW

After helping the Buckeyes to a pair of wins over Southeast Missouri State and then vs. No. 6 Kentucky in Las Vegas, Ohio State freshman D.J. Carton was named the Big Ten's Co-Freshman of the week Dec. 23, 2019. Carton averaged 12.5 points over the two wins while shooting 60% from the field (9-15), going 4-for-4 at the foul line, handing out seven assists, blocking a pair of shots and recording a steal in 25.5 minutes per game off the bench. Against Kentucky, he led the Buckeyes in scoring with 15 points on 5-of-6 shooting. He also grabbed five rebounds, had two assists, two blocks and a steal.

Kaleb Wesson Earns BIG POW

Kaleb Wesson was named the Big Ten Player of the Week Nov. 18, 2019 after a well-rounded effort vs. No. 10 Villanova Nov. 13 at Value City Arena. In a 77-51 win over the Wildcats, Wesson scored 10 points, grabbed 11 rebounds, recorded four blocks, handed out three assists and notched a steal in 35 minutes of game action.

Cincinnati Game Second Earliest Opener in Ohio State History

When Ohio State tipped vs. Cincinnati in the 2019-20 opener, the game was the second earliest opening date in Ohio State history. The Nov. 6, 2019 date with the Bearcats in Columbus was second only to the Nov. 5, 2004 opener, the first game of the Thad Matta era, vs. Towson State in the Guardian's Classic at Value City Arena. Ohio State won that game 74-53. The Buckeyes defeated Cincinnati 64-56 this year.

Matta Enters Ohio State Athletics Hall of Fame

Thad Matta, the all-time winningest coach in Ohio State history, was selected to enter the Ohio State Athletics Hall of Fame during a ceremony Sept. 6, 2019. The 13th coach in program history, Matta recorded 337 career wins, made nine NCAA Tournament appearances, five "Sweet Sixteens," three "Elite Eights" and two Final Fours over 13 seasons (2005-17).

Sueing Selects Ohio State, Eligible in 2020-21

Justice Sueing joined the Ohio State program in May of 2019 following a transfer from the University of California. Sueing, a 6-foot, 6-inch forward from Honolulu, Hawaii, will have two years of eligibility with the Buckeyes after sitting out the 2019-20 campaign to satisfy NCAA transfer rules. Sueing played 31 games for the Golden Bears a season ago. He averaged 14.3 points and 6.0 rebounds while shooting better than 78 percent from the foul line (129-165). While sitting out in Columbus, Sueing underwent successful surgery on a ligament in his left foot Jan. 14. He is expected to recovery fully to participate in offseason workouts.

Diebler Added to Coaching Staff

Jake Diebler, who spent three seasons with the Buckeyes as the team's video coordinator (2014-2016) was hired as an assistant coach with the Buckeyes after spending the last two years as an assistant at Vanderbilt. Diebler, older brother of Ohio State great Jon Diebler, is a 2009 graduate of Valparaiso. He was a standout high school player at Upper Sandusky (Ohio).

Diallo Picks Ohio State

Ibrahima Diallo, a 6-foot, 10-inch center from Senegal, signed a letter of intent to play for Chris Holtmann and the Buckeyes in mid-April 2019. Diallo entered the 2019-20 season along with a stellar freshman class. He joined forwards Alonzo Gaffney and E.J. Liddell and guard D.J. Carton. Diallo played a season ago at Prolific Prep in California where he averaged 11 points, 11 rebounds and nearly four blocks a game.

Notable Numbers--Kaleb Wesson Reaches 1,200

Kaleb Wesson has scored 1,240 career points over three seasons to average 12.9 points for his career. He has played in 96 games with 92 starts.

- Luther Muhammad reached 400 career points with 10 vs. Rutgers (467) ... averaged 7.3 points over 64 games ... he went 8-8 at the line vs. Maryland Feb. 23 to reach 100 made foul shots as a Buckeye ... he shot 80 percent from the line for his career (107-134) and made 85 percent of his shots at the stripe this season (51-60) ... Muhammad made 29 of 30 from the foul line in the last 14 games and 34-36 at the stripe since Dec. 29, 2019 when he was 5-6 vs. West Virginia.
- Musa Jallow, out for the 2019-20 season following a pair of right ankle surgeries, is closing on 1,000 career minutes. In two seasons, he has played 987 minutes in 68 career games (14.5 mpg.) ... he also has 149 career rebounds and 184 career points.
- With a career-high five blocks at Nebraska, freshman E.J. Liddell neared Kaleb Wesson (31) for the team lead with 29 ... Wesson regained the lead with one swat each vs. Illinois and Michigan State in the last two games ... Liddell grabbed a career-high 11 rebounds to go with 17 points vs. Illinois March 5.
- Kaleb Wesson reached 672 career rebounds

while also reaching 1,200 points (1,240) this season ... he scored 14 vs. Michigan March 1 to eclipse 1,200 career points ... with six rebounds at Wisconsin, Wesson became the 22nd Buckeye to corral 600 career boards (672) ... grabbed a career-high 18 rebounds in win at Nebraska to set a career high ... scored 434 points this season for an average of 14.0 points per game ... on the glass, had 215 defensive rebounds, a total of 288 and an average of 9.3 a game this season.

- Kyle Young shot 59 percent from the field this year (72-123) shoots 60 percent for his career (169-282) ... reached 400 career points with a career-high 16 vs. Purdue (417/5.1 ppg.) ... he missed the January Wisconsin and Maryland games after an appendectomy Dec. 29, 2019 which followed an 11-rebound effort vs. West Virginia in Cleveland.
- With 14 points vs. Michigan March 1, Andre Wesson reached 700 career points (730) ... he averaged 5.7 ppg. over his 127-game career ... reached 100 makes from 3-point range with three at Wisconsin.
- CJ Walker hit the 700-point mark for his career with 14 at Michigan State (711) March 8 ... he scored 440 in two years at Florida State and had 271 in his first year as a Buckeye ... recorded seven assists four times this season (vs. Villanova, vs. Penn State, at Iowa, vs. Michigan) ... handed out career assist No. 200 with two at Wisconsin (236) while also grabbing 200th rebound (231) in game vs. the Badgers ... in his last 11 games, Walker is 35-40 at the foul line.
- Duane Washington Jr. scored 13 points off the bench vs. Maryland Feb. 23 to eclipse 500 points as a Buckeye (566/9.0 ppg./63 games) ... he averages 11.5 points a game this season and is shooting 39 percent from distance (55-140) after making 31 percent as a freshman (41-134).

Noting the 2019-20 Ohio State Schedule

- Ohio State played its first seven games of the season, plus an exhibition, at home with six at Value City Arena and one at St. John Arena. Three of the four non-Big Ten games in December were outside Columbus (vs. North Carolina in Big Ten/ACC Challenge (W, 74-49), vs. Kentucky in CBS Sports Classic (Las Vegas, W, 71-65) and vs. West Virginia (L, 67-59) in Cleveland Classic).
- Now in its sixth year, Ohio State again played in the CBS Sports Classic. The event took place in Las Vegas Dec. 21. The Buckeyes defeated then-No. 6 Kentucky (71-65) while North Carolina defeated UCLA.
- Villanova traveled to Ohio State Nov. 13, 2019. The game was part of The Gavitt Games, which pits members of the Big Ten vs. Big East opponents. The Buckeyes downed the No. 10 Wildcats 76-51.
- Two Big Ten Conference games were played in December after the league expanding to a 20-game, regular-season slate in 2018-19. Ohio State played Penn State in Columbus Dec. 7 (W, 106-74) and traveled to Minnesota Dec. 15 (L,

84-71).

- The Buckeyes are 5-1 in December conference games the last three years with wins at Wisconsin and vs. Michigan in 2017 and victories over Minnesota in Columbus and Illinois in Chicago in 2018. The Buckeyes knocked off Penn State 106-74 this year in Columbus Dec. 7 and fell at Minnesota, 84-71, Dec. 15.
- The annual Big Ten Tournament was to be contested in Indianapolis in 2020 before it was canceled March 12. Chicago is up next in 2021 and then back to Indianapolis in 2022.
- The Buckeyes scheduled 18 home games in 2018-19 plus an exhibition contest vs. Cedarville Oct. 30. Ohio State finished 16-2 in home games, including a 15-2 record at Value City Arena and a 1-0 mark at St. John Arena (vs. Kent State, W 71-52, 11/25/19).
- Seven Big Ten teams (Minnesota, Indiana, Michigan, Penn State, Maryland, Wisconsin and Nebraska) battled the Buckeyes twice during the 2019-20 regular season with three (Illinois, Purdue, Rutgers) traveling only to Columbus. Ohio State hit the road to face Iowa, Michigan State and Northwestern.
- Ohio State played 19 regular-season games against 13 teams that advanced to postseason play in 2018-19 (11-8 record vs. those teams in 2019-20). Fifteen games (8-7) were contested vs. 2019 NCAA Tournament teams (Maryland-2, Minnesota-2, Michigan State-1, Michigan-2, Wisconsin-2, Villanova-1, Purdue-1, Cincinnati-1, Iowa-1, Kentucky-1, North Carolina-1) while four contests (3-1) pit the Buckeyes vs. 2019 NIT squads (Indiana-2, Nebraska-2).

Holtmann Era in Columbus

June 9, 2017 marked the first day of the Chris Holtmann era at Ohio State. After six seasons as a head coach, including three at Butler, Holtmann became the 14th head coach in Ohio State men's basketball history. In his young career to date, Holtmann already has earned coach-of-the-year honors in the Big South Conference (2013), where he spent three seasons coaching Gardner-Webb (2001-13), and in the Big East (2017) in the final of three seasons with the Bulldogs. His first game in Columbus, a win over Robert Morris, was the 200th of his head coaching career. Holtmann was named the 2018 Big Ten Coach of the Year, has won at least 20 games in each of his three seasons in Columbus, has taken the Buckeyes to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances and has won an NCAA game each season.

Holtmann Reaches 50 Wins as a Buckeye

Chris Holtmann is working on 300 games as a head coach (299/180-119) and entered the 2020 Big Ten Tournament at 21-10 this year at Ohio State. He won game No. 50 as a Buckeye Nov. 22, 2019 in an 85-46 win over Purdue Fort Wayne at Value City Arena. Holtmann needed 74 games to reach 50 wins at Ohio State, the fourth-fastest among the 14 head coaches in OSU history.

Wesson earned the 12th Ohio Mr. Basketball award among nine players to sign with the Buckeyes out of high school and the 13th among those to ultimately play for Ohio State. Tony Stockman earned the honor in 2000 but elected to start his career at Clemson. He later transferred to Ohio State and played in Columbus in 2004 and 2005.

The Cincinnati Opener

Ohio State opened the 2018-19 season officially Nov. 7, 2018 at Cincinnati, the first meeting against the Bearcats on either team's campus since 1921 (Columbus/L, 33-17/Dec. 10, 1921) and the first time at Cincinnati since the 1920 season (Cincinnati/W, 35-13/Jan. 3, 1920). Ohio State earned a 64-56 win in the first game at renovated Fifth-Third Arena last year and is 8-4 all-time vs. the Bearcats after winning by the identical score, 64-56, Nov. 6 in Columbus. Three of the last six meetings have come in the NCAA Tournament. Cincinnati defeated the Buckeyes for the national championship in both 1961 and 1962. Ohio State defeated UC in the 2006 Wooden Tradition in Indianapolis (72-50) and then most recently in the 2012 NCAA East Regional Semifinals in Boston (81-66).

Throwback Game at St. John Arena

Ohio State played Kent State as part of the 2019 Ohio State Classic at historic St. John Arena Nov. 25. Ohio State won that game 71-52.

A few notes on the venue:

- Ohio State first played at St. John Arena during the 1956-57 season. The last season the Buckeyes called SJA their home was 1997-98. Ohio State began playing at its current home, Value City Arena, in 1998-99.
- Ohio State has an overall record of 433-151 (.741) at SJA, which includes a 7-0 record in games played at SJA since the end of the 1998 season.
- Ohio State defeated Cleveland State 89-62 Nov.

Roster Grows for 2020-21 Buckeyes

Chris Holtmann, now in his third year as the head coach of the Ohio State men's basketball team, announced the addition of two student-athletes to the program's roster for the 2020-21 season.

Eugene Brown III, a 6-6, 185-pound guard from Southwest Dekalb (Georgia) High School, and Zed Key, a 6-8, 230-pound forward from Long Island (New York) Lutheran High School, signed NCAA National Letters of Intent in early November, 2019.

Brown III was the first player from the class of 2020 to commit. Brown, a native of Decatur, Georgia, averaged 9.1 points, 4.6 rebounds and 1.3 assists over his first three years of his high school career, despite a leg injury sidelining him for most of his junior season. In five games as a junior he averaged 13.4 points, 5.4 rebounds and 2.8 assists.

"We are really excited about Eugene," Holtmann said. "He is a gifted perimeter player who has developed a great skill set thanks to many hours in the gym as a coach's son. He plays the game with the energy and competitiveness we want in our student-athletes."

Key, who hails from Brookville, New York, averaged 15.9 points and 8.5 rebounds his junior season. He also was a part of the 2019 New York State Federation Class AA State Championship team (25-2), who defeated Chris The King, 51-31, last March. Key played in four games at the 2019 National Basketball Players Association Top 100 camp, averaging 13.5 points, 6.5 rebounds and 2.5 blocks per game.

"Zed is a great addition to our university and program," Holtmann said. "He plays the game with a high level of physicality and understanding of the game. He has been a part of championship teams in New York and it became clear early on in the recruiting process how important winning is to him."

- Since the Ohio State men's and women's basketball teams moved to Value City Arena, St. John has been the competition home for the men's and women's volleyball, wrestling, fencing and men's and women's gymnastics teams. Those teams moved out of SJA and into the Covelli Center on Ohio State's campus following the 2018-19 season.
- SJA also is filled to capacity prior to each home football game during "Skull Session" where the Ohio State Marching Band practices and briefly welcomes the football Buckeyes on their way to

HEAD COACH CHRIS HOLTSMANN

Chris Holtmann took over the Ohio State men's basketball head coaching position June 12, 2017 after a successful three-year stint as head coach at Butler (2015-2017). He was an assistant at Butler during the 2013-14 season after a three-year run as head coach at Gardner-Webb (2011-13).



Holtmann was named conference coach of the year at both his previous stops earning the honor in 2013 in the Big South and then in 2017 in the Big East following a 25-9 campaign with the Bulldogs. He earned the 2018 Big Ten Coach of the Year Award as well after a 25-9 overall record and a 15-3 campaign and second-place finish in the Big Ten regular season.

The 14th head coach in Ohio State history, Holtmann is a 1994 graduate of Taylor University, where he majored in Psychology. He also has a master's degree in Athletics Administration from Ball State (2000). He was elected to the Taylor University Athletics Hall of Fame in October of 2018.

As a player at Taylor, he earned NAIA All-American status in 1994 under the direction of Paul Patterson.

Prior to becoming a head coach, Holtmann was an assistant for John Groce (Ohio U.) and Brandon Miller (Butler). Both Groce and Miller were former Ohio State assistant coaches.

2019-20 BOX SCORES

Game 1 No. 18 Ohio State 64, Cincinnati 56 Nov. 6, 2019, Columbus

COLUMBUS -- The No. 18 Ohio State men's basketball team opened its 2019-20 season with a 64-56 victory over Cincinnati at Value City Arena. The Buckeyes also opened the 2018-19 season with a 64-56 win over the Bearcats. Kyle Young notched his first-career double-double, going for 14 points and 13 boards, to pace the Buckeyes while D.J. Carton added nine points and Kaleb Wesson went for eight points and 11 boards. Jarron Cumberland and Keith Williams led Cincinnati with 13 points apiece while Chris McNeal chipped in with 10. The Buckeyes struggled out of the gate, falling behind 6-0 before a Young dunk on the fast break made it 6-2 at the 12:20 mark of the opening half. A quick 5-0 Ohio State spurt gave the Buckeyes their first lead at 10-11 but, after the contest was knotted at 15-all, the Bearcats closed the half on an 11-4 run to take a 26-19 lead into the half. Ohio State came out of the break on a roll, opening the half with a 14-3 run spurred on by a pair of Kaleb Wesson 3-pointers, to take a 33-29 lead with 13:17 left to play. The Buckeye lead grew to nine at 52-43 on a Luther Muhammad 3-pointer with 7:12 remaining but Cincinnati answered with an 8-1 run over the next 3:32 to cut their deficit to 53-31 with 4:40 to go. After the teams exchanged baskets, Ohio State scored the next five points to put the contest out of reach at 60-53 with less than a minute remaining.

Notes:

- Ohio State improved to 8-4 all-time against the Bearcats.
- Eight players scored for the Buckeyes: Kyle Young (14), D.J. Carton (9), Kaleb Wesson (8), CJ Walker (8), Duane Washington Jr. (7), Andre Wesson (7), Luther Muhammad (6), and E.J. Liddell.
- Ohio State shot 9-29 (.310) then improved to 11-20 (.550) in the second half.
- Ohio State opened the season against Cincinnati last season at Fifth-Third Arena. The final score of 64-56 exactly matched the score of the game last year.
- Ohio State is 28-1 vs. Ohio teams since the 1995-96 season.
- Ohio State is 28-15 all-time vs. teams representing the American Athletic Conference.
- In season-opening games, Ohio State is 99-21 all-time and 102-17 in the first home game of the season.
- The game vs. UC was the second earliest opener in Ohio State history (Nov. 6), second only to the Nov. 5 season starter vs. Towson State in 2005.
- Ohio State observed a moment of silence pregame in honor of Buckeyes great John Havlicek, who died at age 79 in April.
- Jerry Lucas, who led the Buckeyes to the 1960 NCAA title, three-consecutive NCAA title game appearances (1960-62) and was a three-time first team All-American and two-time national player of the year, was on hand for the game vs. the Bearcats.
- With Kyle Young's first career double double (14 pts./13 rebs.), Ohio State has 915 D-Ds all-time and own a record of 641-274 in those games.

Game 2 No. 18 Ohio State 76, UMass Lowell 56 Nov. 10, 2019, Columbus

COLUMBUS -- The No. 18 Ohio State men's basketball team defeated UMass Lowell, 76-56, at Value City Arena. Kaleb Wesson led five Buckeyes in double figures with his seventh career double-double, going for 13 points, 13 rebounds and five assists. D.J. Carton added 13 points and four assists while Luther Muhammad poured in 11. Obadijah Noel led UMass Lowell with 15 points while Connor Withers came off the bench to tally a double-double with 10 points and 11 boards. UMass Lowell scored the first six points of the game but the Buckeyes responded to score the next seven, taking a 7-6 lead on a Muhammad layup with 15:43 to play in the opening half. A Christian Lutete layup gave the River Hawks a 10-9 advantage with 14:30 remaining but Alonzo Gaffney responded with a 3-pointer for the Buckeyes, who connected on 10 of their 18 shots from the field the rest of the half to take a 38-25 lead into the break. Kaleb Wesson led the Buckeyes with 11 points, 11 rebounds and four assists while Carton scored seven points in the opening half. Withers led the River Hawks with six points in the first 20 minutes.

Notes:

- Five players scored in double digits for the Buckeyes: Alonzo Gaffney (10), Kyle Young (10), Luther Muhammad (11) D.J. Carton (13), and Kaleb Wesson (13).
- The last time Ohio State placed five in double figures was Iowa (2/26/19); Andre Wesson (11), Kaleb Wesson (18), Justin Ahrens (29), Keyshawn Woods (13) and Duane Washington, Jr. (10)
- Ohio State has allowed 20 or fewer field goals in each of the first two games. Cincinnati made 19 buckets, UMass Lowell 20.
- The last time the Buckeyes allowed 20 or fewer field goals in back to back games was in 2018: 20(51), vs. Minnesota (12/2/18) and 19(58) vs. Illinois (12/5/18)
- Freshman Alonzo Gaffney made his first appearance as a Buckeye vs. the River Hawks. He sank his first career field goal attempt, a 3-pointer from the left corner. Duane Washington Jr. was the last to knock down his first shot from 3-point range, last year in the opener at Cincinnati.
- With Kaleb Wesson's double-double (13 pts./13 rebs.), Ohio State has 916 D-Ds all-time and own a record of 642-274 in those games.
- Wesson's D-D was his seventh of his career and first this season. Ohio State is 7-0 when he records a D-D.
- Kaleb Wesson had a double-double in the first half with 11 points and 11 rebounds. Jae'Sean Tate was the last Buckeye with a first half double-double vs. Wisconsin (2/23/17) with 13 points and 10 rebounds.
- Wesson surpassed 400 career rebounds with his 13 2nd total rebounds and now has 408 in his career.

Game 3 No. 16 Ohio State 76, No. 10 Villanova 51 Nov. 13, 2019, Columbus

COLUMBUS -- The No. 16 Ohio State men's basketball raced out to an early 16-point lead and never looked back on its way to a 76-51 win over No. 20 Villanova in a Gavitt Tipoff Games matchup at Value City Arena. Duane Washington Jr. led five Buckeyes in double figures with 14 points to go along with five rebounds while Luther Muhammad added 11 points and D.J. Carton went for 11 points, five boards and five assists. Kaleb Wesson recorded his second-consecutive double-double with 10 points and 11 rebounds while CJ Walker scored 10 points and dished out a game-high seven assists. Jermaine Samuels led Villanova with 14 points while Cole Swider added 11 and Collin Gillespie scored 10. The Ohio State onslaught started early as the Buckeyes connected on their first six shots, including three 3-pointers from Washington Jr. and another from Walker, to take a 19-3 lead after an E.J. Liddell layup at the 15:41 mark of the opening half. The Buckeyes held a 21-7 lead with 14:16 left to play, then held Villanova to two for its next 18 from the field in building a 40-13 lead with 2:26 remaining before halftime.

- Five players scored in double figures for Ohio State: Duane Washington Jr. (14), Luther Muhammad (11), D.J. Carton (11), Kaleb Wesson (10) and CJ Walker (10).
- It's the second time this season the Buckeyes have placed five in double-figures offensively (UMass Lowell)
- The game was part of the Gavitt Tipoff Games. With the win, the Buckeyes are now 3-0 in the event.
- Ohio State's all-time record against Villanova improves to 3-1.
- The Buckeyes shot 30-for-50 (.600), while holding Villanova to 19-for-62 (.306).
- The last time Ohio State connected on 60% of its shots was vs. Purdue Fort Wayne (11/11/18). OSU went 34-56 (.607).
- The last time Ohio State beat an AP Top 10 team was 2/7/18 against No. 3 Purdue when the Buckeyes won 64-63 in West Lafayette.
- The last time Ohio State beat an AP Top 10 team at home was 1/7/18 against No. 1 Michigan State. The Buckeyes won 80-64.
- The 25-point margin of victory over an AP Top 10 team is the largest since 3/6/11 when Ohio State beat No. 10 Wisconsin 93-65. This is the Buckeyes' second largest margin of victory over a Top 10 team.
- Duane Washington Jr. scored 14 points to record a season high.
- Washington went 4-for-6 (.667) on 3FGs for a season-high four made 3-pointers. He went 3-for-5 (.600) on 3-pointers in the first half.

COLUMBUS -- The No. 10 Ohio State men's basketball team picked up an 86-51 victory over Stetson at Value City Arena. Kyle Young paced Ohio State with his second-career double-double with 15 points and 10 rebounds while Kaleb Wesson went for 13 points and eight boards and D.J. Carton scored 10 points and dished out five assists. Eleven Buckeyes scored in the win. Rob Perry led Stetson with 17 points and eight rebounds. The Buckeye defense was the story of the opening half as Ohio State held a 42-14 lead after 20 minutes. After Ohio State scored the first eight points of the game, a Christian Jones 3-pointer got the Hatters on the board at the 16:37 mark of the opening half. The Buckeyes would then go on to score the next 20 points, holding Stetson scoreless over the next 10:40 before a Rob Perry free throw made it 28-4 with 5:57 remaining. Ohio State went on another run, this time a 14-4 spurt, to extend the lead to 42-8 with 1:21 left to play before Jones connected on a pair of 3-pointers late in the half to make it a 28-point game at the break. Nine Buckeyes scored in the opening 20 minutes, led by Kaleb Wesson with nine points, while Ohio State held the Hatters to 14.3 percent (4-for-28) shooting. Perry paced Stetson with seven points at the half.

Purdue Fort Wayne 46
Nov. 22, 2019, Columbus**

COLUMBUS -- The No. 10 Ohio State men's basketball team topped Purdue Fort Wayne, 85-46, at Value City Arena. With the win, which was head coach Chris Holtmann's 50th at the helm, the Buckeyes move to 5-0 on the year while the Mastodons drop to 2-5. Kaleb Wesson led Ohio State with 15 points and seven boards while D.J. Carton added 13 and CJ Walker chipped in with 11 points and a game-high four steals as 11 Buckeyes found the scoring column. Marcus DeBerry scored 16 for Purdue Fort Wayne while Brian Patrick added 13. Ohio State scored the first five points of the game and held a 9-7 lead at the 16:36 mark of the first half after a DeBerry 3-pointer for the Mastodons. The Buckeyes followed with a 16-0 run over a 6:46 spurt to take a 25-7 advantage on a Duane Washington Jr. 3-pointer with 9:25 remaining. Ohio State extended its lead to as many as 21 twice in the final three minutes of the first half before Purdue Fort Wayne scored the final four points of the half as the Buckeyes held a 42-25 lead at the break. Ohio State connected on 10 of its first 14 attempts from the field in the second half on its way to a 27-7 run and a 69-32 advantage with 9:27 remaining. The 3-point ball, including three in a three-minute spurt from Justin Ahrens, then pushed the Buckeye lead to a game-high 46 at 84-38 with 3:56 left to play as Ohio State came away with the convincing victory.

- Three players scored in double-digits for the Buckeyes: Kaleb Wesson (15), D.J. Carton (13) and CJ Walker (11).
- Ohio State's bench outscored Purdue Fort Wayne's bench 40-7. This is back-to-back games with 40-plus bench points.

Nov. 25, 2019, Columbus**

COLUMBUS -- The No. 10 Ohio State men's basketball team used a 17-0 second-half run to pull away from Kent State on its way to a 71-52 victory at St. John Arena. The Buckeyes' Kaleb Wesson totaled 17 points and six rebounds while Duane Washington Jr. went for 16 points, a team-high seven boards and three assists. Danny Pippen scored a game-high 19 points and eight rebounds while Antonio Williams scored 17 for the Golden Flashes. Kent State scored the first five points in a physical first half but the Buckeyes, up 14-13 with 9:37 remaining in the half, took control with a 19-6 run, capped by a D.J. Carton 3-pointer, over the next 7:36, to take a 33-19 lead with just over two minutes left to play. After an Williams jumper for the Golden Flashes and two free throws from Carton, an Anthony Roberts layup with four seconds remaining in the half trimmed the Buckeye lead to 35-23 at the break. A dunk by Wesson and a 3-pointer from Luther Muhammad pushed the Ohio State lead to a game-high 17 at 40-23 with 17:33 left to play but the Golden Flashes responded with a 3-pointer from Pippen and a three-point play from Philip Whittington to make it a 40-29 game with 16:44 remaining. Washington Jr. followed with a layup to push the lead back to 13 but Kent State connected on four of its next six attempts from deep as the Golden Flashes battled back to tie it at 48-41 with 10:30 left to play. However, Muhammad scored the next five points and Carton followed with a highlight-reel layup as the Buckeyes took control with a 17-0 run spanning 6:35 for a 65-58 lead with 3:55 remaining. The Golden Flashes would get no closer than 15 the rest of the way.

Notes:

- Ohio State improves its record to 237-79 versus teams from Ohio with a 71-52 win over Kent State.
- Four players scored in double-digits for Ohio State: Kaleb Wesson (17), Duane Washington Jr. (16), Luther Muhammad (13) and D.J. Carton (11).
- The Buckeyes improved to 7-0 at St. John Arena since the end of the 1998 season.

No. 6 Ohio State 74, No. 7 North Carolina 49 Dec. 4, 2019, Chapel Hill

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. -- The No. 6 Ohio State men's basketball team used a dominant second half to go on the road to defeat No. 7 North Carolina 74-49 in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge at the Dean Smith Center. Duane Washington Jr. led four Buckeyes in double figures with 18 points while E.J. Liddell came off the bench for a career-best 12 points. Kaleb Wesson went for 10 points and nine boards while CJ Walker added 10 points. Cole Anthony paced North Carolina with 15 points while Brandon Robinson chipped in with nine. Ohio State struggled with turnovers in the opening half but took a 29-27 lead into the break. The Buckeyes came out of the half using a 10-3 spurt, capped by layups from Washington Jr. and Kyle Young, to take a 39-30 lead at the 16:49 mark but Anthony responded with a pair of 3-pointers to make it a three-point contest at 39-36 with 15:57 left to play. This time, Ohio State answered with a 15-4 run over the next 4:09, finished by a fast-break dunk by E.J. Liddell, to push its lead to 14 at 52-38 with 11:48 remaining. The Buckeyes then used another 14-0 run over 3:11 to put the game out of reach at 71-47 on a Young layup with 3:40 left in the contest. Ohio State shot 53.6 percent (15-for-28) from the field in the second half and held the Tar Heels to 17-for-62 (27.4 percent) from the field for the game.

Notes:

- The 8-0 start for the Buckeyes is the best for Ohio State since the 2013-14 season when Ohio State opened the season 15-0.
The 25-point margin of victory was the second-largest by an opponent at the Dean Smith Center. The largest margin of victory by an opponent over North Carolina at the Dean Smith Center was a 29-point margin by Duke in an 87-58 win in 2002.
The 27.4 field goal percentage was the lowest by the Tar Heels in the Dean Smith Center.
The 49 points were the third-fewest points by North Carolina at the Dean Smith Center.
Ohio State outscored the Tar Heels by 23 points (45-22) in the second half. The figure is the largest margin by which an opponent has outscored North Carolina in a half at the venue. The previous-highest mark was 22 set by Maryland in 1997 and Temple in 1988.
Ohio State held a 48-32 advantage on the boards, a 25-10 lead in bench points and 30-10 stronghold in points in the paint in the contest.
For the season, Ohio State's bench is outscoring its opponents' bench 244-97.
Ohio State came in limiting its opponents' leading scorers to 10.0 points per game, despite them averaging 15.1 points per game for the season. The Buckeyes continued the trend, limiting Cole Anthony to 15 points on 4-for-15 from the field. Anthony came in averaging 20.7 points per game, the most of any freshman nationally. For the year, Ohio State is holding these opponents to 30.3 percent (30-for-99) from the field and 27.0 percent (10-for-37) from 3-point range.
Four Buckeyes scored in double figures: Duane Washington Jr. (19), E.J. Liddell (12), CJ Walker (10) and Kaleb Wesson (10).

Game 9

No. 6 Ohio State 106, Penn State 74 Dec. 7, 2019, Columbus

COLUMBUS -- The No. 6 Ohio State men's basketball team ran past Penn State, 106-74, in its Big Ten opener at Value City Arena. The Buckeyes eclipsed the 100-point mark against a Big Ten opponent for the first time since 2006. Kaleb Wesson notched his third double-double of the season with 28 points and 10 rebounds while Andre Wesson totaled 15 points and five boards and Luther Muhammad and Duane Washington Jr. scored 14 apiece. Izaiah Brockington paced Penn State with 19 points, while Lamar Stevens, who fouled out with 13:26 remaining, scored 11. Ohio State held an 11-9 lead after a Mike Watkins jumper with 13:55 left to play in the opening half but the Buckeyes went on a 9-0 run over the next 5:01 to push the advantage to 20-9 with 8:54 remaining. Brockington hit a pair of shots later in the half to cut the deficit to seven but a pair of D.J. Carton free throws in the waning seconds of the half gave Ohio State a 46-35 lead at the break. The Buckeyes then caught fire from long distance in the second half. With the Buckeyes up 60-50 with 13:26 remaining, Lamar Stevens, the Nittany Lions' leading scorer, fouled Ohio State's CJ Walker on a shot and then picked up a technical for his fifth foul and the disqualification. Walker followed by making 3-of-4 from the line but Penn State answered right back with a 5-0 spurt of their own to make it a 63-55 game with 12:45 left to play.

Notes:

- The 9-0 start for the Buckeyes is the best for Ohio State since the 2013-14 season when Ohio State opened the season 15-0.
The Buckeyes eclipsed the 100-point mark in a Big Ten game for the first time since a 104-69 victory over Penn State Jan. 5, 2006.
The 106 points are the most since Ohio State scored 107 against Purdue Fort Wayne Nov. 11, 2018.
Ohio State's 14 made 3-pointers and 30 made free throws are both season highs.
Ohio State has outscored its last two opponents by at least 20 points in the second half. The Buckeyes outscored Penn State by 21 points (60-39) after outscoring No. 7 North Carolina by 23 points (45-22).

MINNEAPOLIS -- The No. 3 Ohio State men's basketball team suffered its first loss of the season, an 84-71 decision at Minnesota. D.J. Carton led Ohio State, which was playing without second-leading scorer Duane Washington Jr., with a career-high 19 points while E.J. Liddell scored a career-best 14 and Kaleb Wesson scored 12. Minnesota's Marcus Carr scored a game-high 35, including 28 in the second half, to go along with seven assists while Gabe Kalschauer scored 15 and Daniel Oturu went for 14 points and 13 boards. The contest was back-and-forth early with Ohio State using a Liddell jumper to take a 14-11 lead with 13:15 remaining in the first half. However, Minnesota responded with a 13-2 run over the next 6:00 to pull ahead 24-16 with 7:15 left to play. The Buckeyes cut the deficit to four at 27-23 on a Kaleb Wesson 3-pointer at the 3:49 mark but the Golden Gophers again answered with a run of their own, this time a 9-2 spurt, to go up 36-25 with 1:10 remaining before taking a 38-29 lead into the break. A Luther Muhammad made 3-pointer made it an eight-point game in the opening minute of the second half but Minnesota hit six of its next seven shots from the field, going on a 15-5 run to push the lead to a game-high 18 at 55-37 with 12:29 remaining. Ohio State scored the next six points to trim the deficit to 12 at 55-43 at the 10:15 mark but the Buckeyes would get no closer than nine the remainder of the way.

- Three Buckeyes scored in double figures: D.J. Carton (19), E.J. Liddell (14) and Kaleb Wesson (12).

- Chris Holtmann falls to 2-1 all-time against Minnesota.
- Holtmann dropped his first December Big Ten contest and now sits 5-1 in such games.
- D.J. Carton scored a career-high 19 points on 6-for-12 shooting.
- E.J. Liddell went for a career-best 14 points while tying his career-high five rebounds.
- Also blocked two shots and recorded two steals.
- Andre Wesson made the start against the Golden Gophers, his first since the season-opener against Cincinnati. Wesson suffered an eye injury in that contest and was forced to miss the following two games.

COLUMBUS -- The No. 5 Ohio State men's basketball team topped Southeast Missouri, 80-48 Value City Arena. Kaleb Wesson notched his fourth double-double of the season with 18 points and 10 rebounds while Andre Wesson scored 14, Kyle Young went for 10 points and nine boards and D.J. Carton totaled 10 points, five boards and five assists. DQ Nicholas and Isaiah Gable each scored 10 for the Redhawks. The Buckeyes battled back from a sluggish start to take a 35-26 lead at the break. Southeast Missouri held a 16-12 lead after an Isaiah Gable 3-pointer with 9:39 remaining in the half before Ohio State went on a 13-1 spurt over the next 4:01 to take a 25-17 lead on a Kaleb Wesson layup at the 4:58 mark. The Redhawks cut the lead to five twice in the final two minutes but the Buckeyes' CJ Walker scored the final four points of the half as Ohio State took a nine-point advantage into the break. Ohio State then pushed its lead to a game-high 38 at 78-40 with 3:17 remaining after a pair of Andre Wesson 3-pointers as the Buckeyes picked up their 10th win of the season.

LAS VEGAS -- The No. 5 Ohio State men's basketball team held off No. 6 Kentucky for a 71-65 victory in the CBS Sports Classic at T-Mobile Arena in Las Vegas. D.J. Carton led a balanced Buckeye attack with 15 points while Kaleb Wesson went for 10 points and eight rebounds and Kyle Young totaled 10 points and six boards. Nate Sestina paced Kentucky with 17 points while Tyrese Maxey went for 15 points and six rebounds. Ashton Hagans scored 14 points while dishing out a game-high nine assists for the Wildcats. Both teams shot at least 50 percent from the field in a back-and-forth opening half as neither team held a lead of more than four points. A hookshot from Wesson followed by a pair of free throws from Young gave the Buckeyes a 6-2 advantage at the 16:34 mark but the Wildcats battled back, taking a 19-15 lead on a 3-pointer by Sestina with 10:32 remaining in the half. However, Ohio State regained its advantage at 22-21 on a Carton layup with 8:30 left to play, pushing it to four twice in the final minutes of the half before another Sestina 3-pointer cut the Buckeye lead to 37-36 at the break. Sestina hit his first three from deep in the second half, moving to 5-for-8 from 3-point range for the game, to keep the Wildcats in it at 45-44 with 14:11 left to play, but the Buckeyes scored the next six points over the next 3:24 to push their lead a game-high seven at 51-44 with 10:47 left to play.

Notes:

- With the victory against the Wildcats, Ohio State earned its third victory against an *Associated Press* Top 10 team this season, marking the first time Ohio State had won three such games since the 2012-13 season. The Buckeyes defeated Michigan State twice and Indiana once in that campaign.
- With Andre and Kaleb Wesson each appearing in the game against the Wildcats, members of the Wesson family have combined to appear in 300 career games for Ohio State. Andre has appeared in 108 career games while Kaleb has played in 77 contests. Their father, Keith, played in 115 career games for the Buckeyes from 1983-87.
- Three Buckeyes scored in double figures while seven scored at least seven points against the Wildcats.
- Ohio State held a 33-25 lead on the boards in the contest.
- The Buckeyes connected on 22-of-44 attempts from the field against the Wildcats. The contest marked the fifth time this season Ohio State shot at least 50 percent from the field.
- The Buckeyes finished 21-for-27 from the free throw line while Kentucky went 8-for-13 from the charity stripe. The game marked the sixth time this season Ohio State made at least as many free throws as its opponents attempted.
- Ohio State improves to 10-11 all-time against Kentucky and 39-35 all-time against current members of the Southeastern Conference.
- The game marked head coach Chris Holtmann's first against the Wildcats.
- D.J. Carton scored 15 points on 5-for-6 from the field.
- Duane Washington Jr. has connected on at least one 3-pointer in each of his last nine games.
- Kaleb Wesson went for 10 points and eight rebounds, scoring in double figures for his 11th-consecutive game.

CLEVELAND -- The No. 2 Ohio State men's basketball team fell to No. 22 West Virginia, 67-59, Rocket Mortgage Fieldhouse in Cleveland. Kaleb Wesson led Ohio State with 17 points to go along with nine boards while Duane Washington Jr. scored 12 and Luther Muhammad and CJ Walker scored 10 apiece. Miles McBride went for a game-high 21 points for the Mountaineers while Chase Harler poured in 10. The Buckeyes got out to an early lead in a tightly-contested first half but were never able to push the advantage to more than four before a Harler 3-pointer gave the Mountaineers their second lead of the contest with 7:38 remaining in the opening period. With the game tied at 24-all with 6:19 left to play, Ohio State went on a 13-4 spurt over the next 5:17 to regain the lead at 37-28 with 1:02 remaining before a Sean McNeil 3-pointer trimmed the Buckeye advantage to 37-31 at the break. The Mountaineers came out of the break on a 10-3 run, using a 3-pointer and a jumper from McBride, to take a 41-40 lead with 13:28 remaining. West Virginia then pushed its lead to 52-47 on a 3-point play by Jermaine Haley with 8:38 left to play but the Buckeyes answered right back, using four free throws from Kaleb Wesson and a 3-pointer from Andre Wesson to regain the lead at 54-53 at the 4:40 mark. However, the Buckeyes missed five of their next six shots as West Virginia went on an 8-0 run over the next 4:43 to take a 61-54 lead with 57 seconds left to play. Kaleb Wesson followed with a 3-pointer to trim the deficit to 61-57 and the Buckeyes forced a turnover on the ensuing inbounds play but a Washington Jr. 3-pointer rimmed out and Kaleb Wesson's follow-up layup was blocked as the Mountaineers came away with the win.

COLUMBUS -- The No. 5 Ohio State men's basketball team dropped a 61-57 decision to Wisconsin at Value City Arena. Kaleb Wesson notched his fifth double-double of the season with 22 points and 13 boards while Duane Washington Jr. added 18. Nate Reuvers led Wisconsin with 17 points and nine rebounds while Kobe King poured in 13. Ohio State raced out to an early 7-0 lead on a Kaleb Wesson layup with 16:33 remaining but the Buckeyes missed six of their next seven shots as Wisconsin trimmed the deficit to 9-8 on a King jumper with 11:22 remaining in the half. The Buckeyes held a 23-19 advantage after a pair of Andre Wesson free throws with 2:06 left to play but the Badgers went on a 10-2 run the rest of the way, capped by 3-pointers from Trevor Anderson and Aleem Ford, to take 29-25 lead into the break. Ohio State trailed 31-28 less than a minute into the second half before going on a 10-0 run over a 2:21 spurt to take a 38-31 lead with 16:58 left to play. The Buckeye lead remained at six at 45-39 with 9:19 left to play but the Badgers pulled back even with an 8-2 run over 2:28 to knot the score at 47-all with 6:51 remaining. The Buckeyes held a 51-49 advantage at the under-4 timeout with 3:47 to go but Wisconsin scored 12 of the next 15 points over the next 3:44 to gain a commanding 61-54 lead in the final seconds before a Washington Jr. 3-pointer made it a four-point game.

Anthony Cowan Jr. poured in 20 for the Terrapins while Jalen Smith went for 11 points and seven rebounds and Darryl Morsell scored 10. Ohio State ran out to an 8-0 lead, limiting Maryland to 0-for-5 from the field with three turnovers before Eric Ayala hit a free throw at the 14:33 mark to make it an 8-1 contest. The Terrapins scored 11 of the next 14 points on their way to their first lead of the game at 12-11 after a Serrel Smith Jr. 3-pointer with 9:57 remaining in the half. After holding a 19-17 advantage with 4:17 left to play, Maryland went on a 9-3 spurt to increase the advantage to 28-20 with 2:39 remaining before a CJ Walker jumper in the final minute made it a 28-22 contest at the half. A 3-pointer and a layup by Andre Wesson trimmed the Maryland lead to 31-29 with 18:15 left to play but the Buckeyes missed their next 12 shots from the field as the Terrapins went on a 10-2 run to extend their advantage to 41-31 after a Cowan Jr. 3-pointer with 12:58 remaining. D.J. Carton went for 13 points and five assists while Andre Wesson scored 11 and Kyle Young and E.J. Liddell chipped in the 10 apiece. Thorbjarnarson led Nebraska with 15 points and six boards while Cam Mack, Yvan Ouedraogo and Jervy Green each scored 10. After Nebraska scored the first four points of the game, Ohio State responded with a 9-0 run on three 3-pointers by Andre Wesson, to take a 9-4 advantage with 15:51 to play in the half. Ohio State extended its lead to 16 when a Justin Ahrens 3-pointer made it 36-20 with under two minutes left in the half before taking a 38-25 lead into the break. Ohio State pushed the lead to 46-28 on a 3-pointer from Carton with 18:17 left to play but the Huskers were able to come back, trimming the Buckeye advantage to 56-43 on a Thorbjarnarson 3-pointer with 11:54 remaining. However, the Buckeyes connected on four of their next six shots from the field, including a pair of Walker 3-pointers, to use a 12-0 spurt take a commanding 68-43 lead to put the contest out of reach with 8:25 left to play.

Minnesota 62, Ohio State 57

COLUMBUS -- The Ohio State men's basketball team was edged by Minnesota, 62-59, on Marcus Carr's 3-pointer with three seconds remaining at Value City Arena. Kyle Young paced the Buckeyes with 14 points to go along with six rebounds while Duane Washington Jr. scored 12 and CJ Walker added 11. Carr led the Golden Gophers with 21 points and seven boards while Gabe Kalscheur scored 13 and Daniel Oturu poured in 11 points, all coming in the second half. The contest was back-and-forth early before the Golden Gophers took a 12-7 lead on a Payton Willis 3-pointer at the 14:17 mark of the opening half. Minnesota held a 22-21 lead with 7:30 left to play but the Buckeyes went on a 14-3 spurt to gain a 35-25 advantage with 2:00 remaining before carrying a 37-28 lead into the break. Minnesota came out firing in the second half, trimming the Buckeye lead to 39-36 less than four minutes in. Ohio State was able to push the lead to five two more times before a Carr layup gave the Golden Gophers a 49-48 lead with 7:52 remaining. The teams continued to exchange blows until back-to-back buckets from Young gave the Buckeyes a 59-57 lead with 1:09 left to play. However, Carr followed with a layup to tie it and, after a Kaleb Wesson missed 3-pointer on the ensuing possession, Carr hit a 3-pointer from the right wing with three seconds remaining to give the Golden Gophers the 62-59 lead.

Ohio State 71, Northwestern 59

Jan. 26, 2020, Evanston

EVANSTON, Ill. -- The Ohio State men's basketball team picked up a 71-59 victory over Northwestern at Welsh-Ryan Arena. D.J. Carton paced Ohio State with 17 points while Justin Ahrens provided a spark off the bench with a season-high 12 and Andre and Kaleb Wesson each scored 11. Miller Kopp led Northwestern with 20 points while Pat Spencer chipped in with 13. Northwestern scored the first seven points of the contest and held a 13-4 lead with 13:23 remaining in the opening half as Ohio State missed nine of its first 10 shots from the field. However, the Buckeyes bounced back to connect on 11 of their next 14 shots, including five from long distance, to gain the advantage and push it to a 36-26 lead on a Luther Muhammad 3-pointer with 3:29 to play, before the Wildcats closed the half on a 9-2 spurt to make it a 38-35 contest at the half. Andre Wesson led Ohio State with 11 points while Ahrens added six on a pair of 3-pointers in the opening 20 minutes. Northwestern battled back to regain a 44-41 lead on a Boo Bueie 3-pointer with 14:44 left to play but the Buckeyes responded with a 14-2 spurt, capped by an Ahrens 3-ball, over the next 3:14 to take a 55-46 advantage at the 11:30 mark. The Wildcats cut the deficit to four on two different occasions down the stretch but back-to-back 3-pointers from CJ Walker and Duane Washington Jr. put the game out of reach at 69-56 with less than three minutes left in the contest.

COLUMBUS -- The Ohio State men's basketball team topped Indiana, 68-59, at Value City Arena. Kaleb Wesson notched his ninth double-double of the season with 15 points and 11 rebounds while CJ Walker went for 14 points, four assists and three steals. Andre Wesson scored 10 points and dished out four assists while Justin Ahrens poured in 11 points. Devonte Green led Indiana with 13 points while Rob Phinsee added 11. Indiana held an early 7-6 lead after a Joey Brunk dunk at the 17:06 mark of the opening half but the Buckeyes went on a 14-3 spurt, capped by an Andre Wesson 3-pointer, over the next 7:31 to take a 20-10 advantage with 9:35 left to play. Ohio State would extend its lead to as many as 14 with 6:13 left to play but the Hoosiers battled back, making it a 31-22 contest on Green's half-court heave at the first-half buzzer. Game 22 Ohio State 61, Michigan 58 Feb. 4, 2020, Ann Arbor

ANN ARBOR, Mich. -- Behind 23 points and 12 rebounds from Kaleb Wesson, the Ohio State men's basketball team edged Michigan, 61-58, at Crisler Center. Wesson's double-double was his third in a row, 10th of his junior campaign and 16th of his career. Duane Washington Jr. added 17 points for the Buckeyes while Kyle Young poured in 12 points and pulled down five boards. Zavier Simpson paced Michigan with 12 points to go along with seven rebounds and five assists while Austin Davis chipped in with 11 points. In a physical opening half, Ohio State bounced back from a 5-0 deficit behind a strong effort from Wesson as the junior center scored 12 of the Buckeyes' first 16 points to pull Ohio State ahead 16-7 with 8:52 remaining. However, the Wolverines, who missed 14 of their first 17 shots from the field, went on a 15-5 spurt over the next 5:21 to regain the lead at 22-21 with 3:31 left to play. Justin Ahrens then hit a 3-pointer and E.J. Liddell made a layup to push the Buckeyes in front 26-22 with 2:16 remaining but an Eli Brooks 3-pointer with 1:19 left in the half cut the Ohio State lead to 28-27 at the break. The second half was back-and-forth once again, with neither team holding a lead of more than three points until consecutive buckets from Washington Jr. and Young gave the Buckeyes a 46-42 advantage with 7:05 to go in the contest. Washington Jr. again came up big with a 3-pointer to push Ohio State on top at 57-56 with 54 seconds to go. On the Wolverines' ensuing possession, Simpson drove to the hoop and was fouled by Young on the shot but Simpson pulled the Buckeyes' forward down, resulting in a flagrant foul on the Michigan guard. Simpson and Young each followed by making their respective free throws as Ohio State held a 59-58 advantage with 33 seconds left on the clock. CJ Walker was then fouled with 17 seconds remaining and calmly hit a pair of shots from the charity stripe for the 61-58 win.

LINCOLN, Neb. -- The No. 23 Ohio State men's basketball team picked up a 75-54 victory over Nebraska at Pinnacle Bank Arena. Kaleb Wesson went for 16 points and a career-high 18 rebounds for his 11th double-double of the year while CJ Walker went for 15 points and five boards and Duane Washington Jr. poured in 14 points. Dathon Burke led Nebraska with 13 points while Cam Mack added 12. Ohio State hit nine of its first 11 shots, including three-straight 3-pointers from Washington Jr. to open the game, as the Buckeyes sprinted out to a 26-12 lead with 10:50 remaining. However, as the Buckeyes went on to miss their next 11 shots from the field, Ohio State stepped it up on the defensive end, limiting Nebraska to just three of its next 11 from the floor to extend its advantage to 39-18 with 2:59 left in the half before taking a 43-27 advantage into the break. Washington Jr. paced the Buckeyes with 14 in the opening 20 minutes while Walker added 11. Mack led the Huskers with seven. Ohio State then pushed its lead to a game-high 21 at 55-34 on a Luther Muhammad layup with 14:07 left in the game. The Huskers cut the deficit to 59-43 on a Jervey Green layup with 10:43 left but they'd get no closer as the Buckeyes improved to 9-8 in conference play. For the game, Ohio State held a 48-33 lead on the boards and limited the Huskers to 18.8 percent (3-for-16) from deep.

- Three Buckeyes scored in double figures: Kaleb Wesson (16), Duane Washington Jr. (14) and CJ Walker (15).

COLUMBUS -- The No. 23 Ohio State men's basketball team pulled away from No. 19 Michigan in a 77-63 victory at Value City Arena. Duane Washington Jr. led the Buckeyes with a game-high 20 points while CJ Walker went for 15 points, seven assists and six rebounds. Kaleb Wesson totaled 14 points and nine boards while Andre Wesson scored 14 points and Luther Muhammad poured in 10. Franz Wagner paced Michigan with 18 points and 10 boards while Xavier Simpson scored 12. Michigan opened with an early 9-5 lead but the Buckeyes used a 10-2 spurt to take a 15-11 lead on an E.J. Liddell jumper with 11:43 remaining. The Wolverines bounced back to regain an 18:15 advantage with 8:48 left to play but Ohio State responded once again with a 10-0 run, capped by a pair of Washington Jr. 3-pointers, over the next 2:03 to take a 25-18 lead before holding a 32-29 advantage at the break. After Walker scored the opening bucket of the second half, the Wolverines scored the next nine to take a 38-34 lead but Ohio State answered with a 12-2 run to regain a 46-40 lead. Michigan came back to tie it at 54-40 on a Jon Teske jumper with 6:27 remaining but Walker hit another jumper and Andre and Kaleb Wesson each followed with a 3-pointer as the Buckeyes opened up a 62-54 lead at the 5:07 mark. Ohio State pushed that lead to 70-58 on a Kaleb Wesson layup with 2:19 remaining as the Buckeyes picked up their third-consecutive victory.

COLUMBUS -- The No. 19 Ohio State men's basketball team overcame a seven-point halftime deficit to pull away from No. 23 Illinois, 71-63, on Senior Night at Value City Arena. The win sent seniors Andre Wesson and Danny Hummer off with a victory in their final home game. Kaleb Wesson scored 15 of his team-high 19 in the second half while E.J. Liddell recorded his first-career double-double with a career-high 17 points and 11 boards and CJ Walker totaled 15 points, six rebounds and five assists. Ayo Dosunmu scored a game-high 21 while Andres Feliz went for 11 points and 11 rebounds for the Illini. The Illini led by as many as 11 before the Buckeyes used a 15-4 run to knot the score at 24-24 on an Andre Wesson 3-ball with 6:02 remaining. However, Illinois responded to close the half on a 13-6 spurt to take a 37-30 lead into the break. Feliz opened the second half with a layup to push the Illini lead to 39-30 but the Buckeyes answered with a 10-0 run over 3:07, capped by a Kaleb Wesson 3-pointer, to take a 40-39 advantage with 15:38 left to play. Illinois battled back to take a 49-42 lead with 12:37 remaining but Ohio State again responded, this time with a 14-2 spurt, to take a 56-51 advantage on a pair of Liddell free throws with 6:31 to go in the contest. Illinois trimmed the deficit to 58-55 with 4:45 left but Kaleb Wesson scored the next five on a 3-point play and a layup to push the Buckeye advantage to 63-55 at the 3:39 mark. A pair of Andre Wesson free throws kept the Buckeye lead at 65-57 with 1:54 left but Trent Frazier hit the back end of a one-and-one and Feliz followed with a steal and a score but make it a 65-60 contest with 1:26 left but Liddell followed with a layup and Walker pick-pocketed Feliz the next time down the floor to put the game out of reach.

Notes:

- Three Ohio State managers and two student-athletes were recognized on senior night: Sean Gill, Matt Plank, Avery Van Reeth, Danny Hummer, and Andre Wesson.
- Ohio State Athletics recognized the 1960 National Championship team at halftime of the game.
- Three Buckeyes scored in double figures: Kaleb Wesson (19), E.J. Liddell (17) and CJ Walker (15).
- The Buckeyes finished the 2019-20 home season with a home record of 16-2. Ohio State has won 277 games at Value City Arena over the last 22 seasons.

Washington Jr. cut the deficit to 62-54 on a 3-pointer the next trip down the court but Ohio State would be unable to get any closer the rest of the way.

- Four Buckeyes scored in double figures: Duane Washington Jr. (16), CJ Walker (14), E.J. Liddell (12) and Luther Muhammad (10).
- Ohio State dropped to 57-72 overall against the Spartans and 17-43 when playing in East Lansing.
- When both teams are ranked, Michigan State leads the Buckeyes 10-7.
- Ohio State shot 16-for-19 (.842) from the free throw line.
- CJ Walker went 7-for-10 (.700) from the floor to chip in 14 points.
- Luther Muhammad has shot 29-for-30 from the free throw line in the last 14 games.
- With his 10 points, Muhammad scored in double-digits for the 10th time this season.
- Kaleb Wesson moved up to No. 35 on the Ohio State career scoring list with eight points in the contest, bringing him to 1,240 points. He sits in a tie with Ron Stokes, current expert analyst on the Ohio State radio network.
- Wesson went 6-for-6 from the free throw line.
