If no athletic trainer is traveling with the team, please inform us as soon as possible so arrangements can be made. An order from a physician or AT is required for treatments to be provided. If you have any further questions feel free to contact us at any time.

The following items will be available for practice(*) and competition:

10 gallons of water w/cups*	Chest w/ice bags and wrap*	Biohazard materials
10 gallons of Gatorade w/cups*	Emergency equipment	Towels for bench

An Ohio State team physician, certified athletic trainer, and athletic training student will be present for the entirety of the competition. EMS will be on-call.

Please let us know if there is anything you will need during your visit and we will do our best to accommodate your request. If you are practicing on site, please notify us at least 24 hours in advance so arrangements can be made.
