**JENNY CHUASIRIPORN, LIZETTE SALAS AND KRISTEN WHITE TO
BE INDUCTED INTO THE WGCA PLAYERS HALL OF FAME**

CORAL SPRINGS, Florida (October 28, 2021) – Jenny Chuasiriporn of Duke University, Lizette Salas of the University of Southern California, and Kristen White of Ohio State University will be inducted into the WGCA Players Hall of Fame on Sunday evening, December 5, 2021. The Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony will take place at Planet Hollywood Resort in Las Vegas, Nevada. Chuasiriporn, Salas and White become the 79th, 80th and 81st members of the WGCA Players Hall of Fame.

In four years at Duke University, Jenny Chuasiriporn helped lead the Blue Devils to four ACC Championships and the 1999 NCAA Title. She earned ACC Rookie of the Year honors in 1996 before going on to win ACC Player of the Year three straight years (1997, 1998, 1999). The Timonium, Maryland native was also the first player in conference history to win multiple ACC individual championships after claiming back-to-back titles in 1996 and 1997. A four-time WGCA All-American, including First-Team honors her final three seasons, Chuasiriporn capped of her senior year by winning the Golfstat Cup after leading the nation in stroke average (72.94). The 1998 U.S. Women's Open runner-up currently ranks fourth in school history with seven career wins.



Lizette Salas graduated from the University of Southern California as the program's first-ever four-time WGCA All-American, earning First-Team honors twice. During her freshman season in 2008, she helped lead the Trojan's to the NCAA title after being named Pac-10 Freshman of the Year. The Azusa, California native went on to be named Pac-10 Player of the Year twice and was a 2011 Honda sports Award Finalist. Her 14 career rounds in the 60s are the sixth-most in USC history, while her 72.53 career stroke average ranks seventh in the record books. Salas, a five-time Solheim Cup participant (2013, 2015, 2017, 2019, 2021), has been one of the most consistent LPGA Tour members since turning pro in 2011 with 24 career top-10 finishes and one win.



A three-time WGCA All-American at Ohio State University, Kristen White helped lead the Buckeyes to four consecutive Big Ten titles and four straight top-10 finishes at the NCAA Championships. After earning Big Ten Freshman of the Year accolades, she went on to become Ohio State's only two-time Big Ten Player of the Year (2003, 2005) and earned the individual Big Ten title her senior year. The Doylestown, Pennsylvania native is a staple in the program's record books, ranking in the top-five in both career wins (4) and career scoring average (75.26) while holding the school record in career eagles (12). She was also inducted into the Ohio State Athletics Hall of Fame in 2011. The 2005 Big Ten Conference Medal of Honor winner is also Ohio State's only four-time WGCA All-American Scholar.
