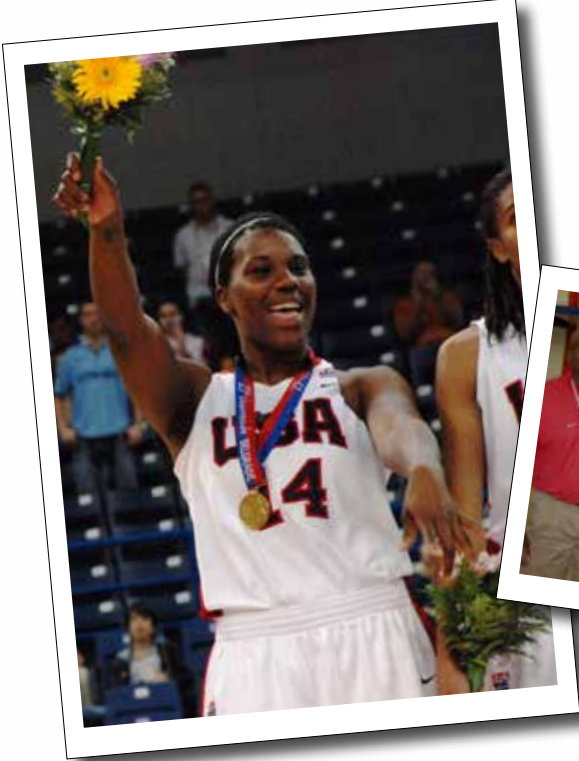

## BASKETBALL

Buckeyes have earned roster spots on every team sponsored by the organizing body, including Katie Smith who became the first player to represent the Scarlet and Gray as a member of a U.S. Olympic Team in 2000. Smith won the gold with the 2000 squad in Sydney, Australia, brought home her second gold medal as a member of the 2004 U.S. Olympic squad in Athens, Greece and won her third gold medal at the 2008 Beijing Games in China.

# OHIO STATE AND THE WNBA

Ohio State has built a solid connection with the WNBA with 14 draft picks since 2001, including five first-round selections since 2007. Three Buckeyes were selected early in the first round in three consecutive seasons from 2011-13 in Jantel Lavender, Samantha Prahalis and Tayler Hill.

Lavender, Ohio State's all-time leading scorer and rebounder, was chosen fifth overall in the 2011 Draft by the Los Angeles Sparks.

Prahalis, the Big Ten's all-time assists leader, was chosen 6th overall in 2012 by the Phoenix Mercury and went on to earn WNBA All-Rookie Team honors.

Hill was selected fourth overall by Washington in 2013 and helped the Mystics reach the WNBA playoffs that year.

In April 2007, Jessica Davenport was selected No. 2 overall in the WNBA Draft by San Antonio. She was traded to New York, where she helped the Liberty reach the playoffs.

Brandie Hoskins also was drafted in the 2007, going in the third round to Seattle and Marscilla Packer was selected in the 2008 draft by the Phoenix Mercury.

In October 2008 Katie Smith, a two-time All-American at Ohio State from 1993-96, led the Detroit Shock to their third WNBA title in six years and was named Finals MVP – this less than two months after winning her third gold medal at the Beijing Olympics. Smith averaged 20.6 points in the three-game sweep. She played her final WNBA season in 2013 with the New York Liberty and left the game as the all-time leading scorer in the history of women's professional basketball.

Kelsey Mitchell was taken No. 2 overall in the 2018 draft by the Indiana Fever. Her teammate, Stephanie Mavunga was then taken by the Fever with the second pick in the second round. That marked the first time Buckeye teammates were selected by the same team in the same draft.

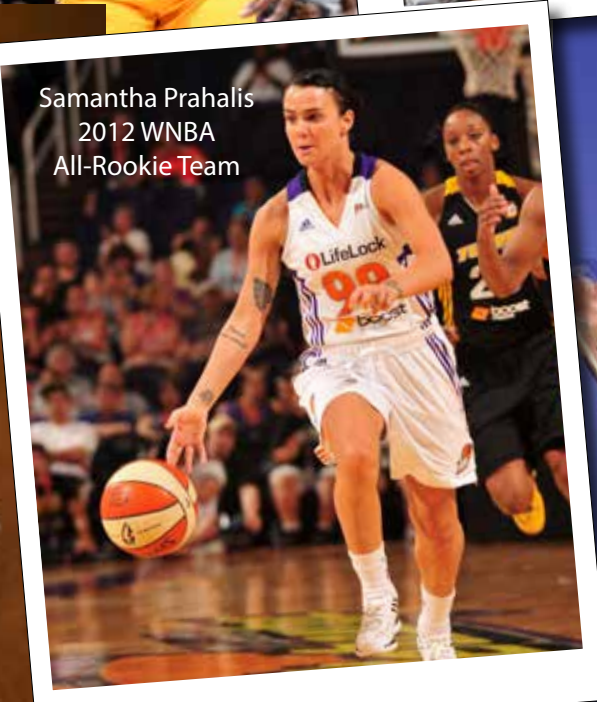
